
Ladies Bible Study

The Benefits of Worship Psalm 63:1-11

The Point: We find all we need when we come to God in worship.

The Bible Meets Life: An "ambiguous image." This form of artwork refers to an image that can be viewed from two entirely different perspectives. One classic example is a drawing that viewed one way is of a young woman, but viewed another appears to be an elderly woman. Another is known as "Rubin's Vase," where from one viewpoint, a vase is seen and from the other, two men are facing each other. It's a classic trick that our own brain can play on us—we see what we're expecting to see.

Psalm 63 is a beautiful example of David seeing what he chose to see. From one perspective, the king could have only seen the desolate wilderness of Judah as he ran from his enemies. But from the perspective of worship, he saw the glory and strength of God on his isolation and desperation. But instead, he saw God's rich provision. He could have fixated on his enemies, but David saw his God, whose arm would protect him from all harm and bring justice to his accusers.

Look around at your life. What's your perspective? When is comes to worship, it all depends on what—and more importantly who—you see.

Live It Out: The Starting Place. Write your own "psalm" based on the outline of Psalm 63. Begin with a statement about who God is to you and how much you need Him in your life. Continue with a list of ways you want to praise Him. Add a testimony of what God is doing in your life. Make your own statement of commitment to follow Him. Finish it by declaring confidently how you expect God to move in your circumstances. The Growing Place. Start a "psalm" prayer journal. As you read through the psalms, look for ones whose structure would lend themselves to first-person application. The Sowing Place. Take the psalm you have composed about your life and share it with a friend or family member. Give this person the context of what it means in your life right now.
